Safeguarding Statement for Young People



The rights of young people at Launceston Church Grammar School.

We at Launceston Grammar believe that young people who participate in our activities, events or programs should:

- Feel comfortable;
- Be cared for:
- Be safe and feel safe;
- Have a right to contact your parents or others if you feel unsafe, uncomfortable or distressed at any time during an activity, event or program;
- Activities, events or programs that we provide for you are to be suitable for your age and development, and taken by appropriately qualified staff;
- Be supportive to help you make good choices;
- Be provided with clear directions and given an opportunity to redirect your behaviour in a
 positive manner if staff believe that you have broken program rules and/or misbehaved;
- NOT be subject to disciplinary action involving physical punishment, or any form of treatment that could reasonably be considered degrading, cruel, frightening or humiliating;
- Contribute suggestions and feedback on an activity, event or program in which you have participated;
- Always be listened to, and believe that what you feel is real; and
- Give you access to safe places, safe spaces and act to help you.
